The MCPOSFI is charged with overseeing the ceremonial aspects of SFI, to include coordination with the SFMC on honor guard and Final Mission details. While the SFMC presently hosts the training for such details, the MCPOSFI shall maintain a knowledge of capable and proficient members, who would be good candidates to lead SFI ceremonial details. Either themselves, or their appointed staff, would maintain proficiency for all SFI ceremonial

events, and be able to advise the CS, regions and chapters about them, and how to establish their own programs.
