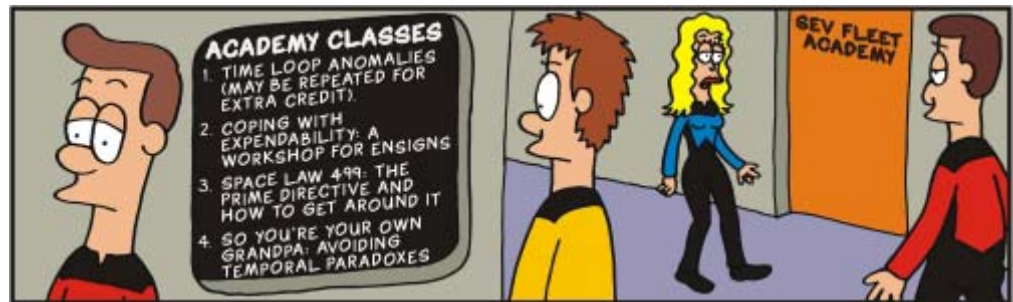

## Recently Opened – The Orion Orientation College

We were first introduced to the Orions in Star Trek before Captain Kirk, when the Talosians cast Captain Pike into one of their illusions, with Vina as an exotic Green Orion Slave Girl. Another green Orion woman was the Consort of Garth of Izar when he took over the prison he had been sent to. In Enterprise, Captain Archer found out about the Orion Syndicate and its slave trade when he had to rescue nine of his own crew from the slave market on Verex III.

But do you really KNOW the Orions?

Of the Star Trek aliens, the Orions are perhaps the least talked about or seen on screen. They interfered with the Babel Conference in "The Journey to Babel" but we never got to see them. Miles O'Brien was whisked away from DS9 to undertake a secret infiltration of the Orion Syndicate, yet the persons he dealt with appeared largely human.

Who are the Orions? Where do they come from? What motivates them? How long have they been around? 'Tis a tale of hardship and victory and greed and all the other things we can think of. If it can be dreamed up, the Orions have probably seen it.

All of it will soon be available to the officers of Starfleet when the Orion Orientation College opens, currently scheduled for late Summer 2010. Currently planned are six 100 level courses covering the Orion Home System, the Orion Colonies, the Orion People, Orion Society, Early Orion History, and Late Orion History. These will be followed by at least one 200 and 300 level course each. Source material will be provided in an extensive reference manual assembled just for the Orion Orientation College.

## Lets Encourage Our Future Space Program – The Cadet College of Space History

Think there might be a budding Neil Armstrong sleeping in Buzz Lightyear pajamas upstairs? Has your fourteen-year-old chemist-in-the-making just taken out your kitchen wall and you are looking for better ways to channel his or her talents? What about the Space Program?

Man's exploration of space has a long history of youngsters who had their parents scratching their heads too. Sometimes it just takes the right motivation. And the Cadet College of Space history can help. In it, you will find courses already available to teach the Next Generation space explorer about all that has gone into Man's efforts to reach beyond his own world and find answers to questions like "What is really out there?" and "Are we really alone?"

Currently, six 200 level courses, meant primarily for early teens, but available to any cadet, cover the early and late history of the Manned American Space Program, the Soviet Manned Space Program, the Russian and Ukrainian Manned Programs, the European Space Agency, and the Japanese Space Program. Coming Summer of 2010 is a new course about the Chinese Space Program. Also this summer is the first 100 level course "Astronauts and Their Nationalities," focusing on the many men and women from all over the globe and a wide ranging group of ethnicities who have actually been to space.

Today, the space program has been seriously ignored. Kids are more interested in video games or the stock market than who's just discovered another comet. But history has shown us that much of what we take for granted started out helping us get into space. Surely there is more out there for us, and especially our children, to discover.

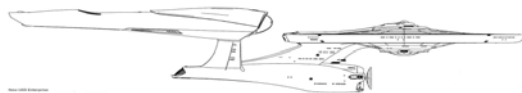

# Patrick Stewart Knighted by Queen of England



LONDON - [Patrick Stewart](#) has been upgraded from captain - to knight. The actor - famous for playing Capt. Jean-Luc Picard on "[Star Trek: The Next Generation](#)" - officially became Sir Patrick Stewart when he was knighted by Queen Elizabeth II at Buckingham Palace on Wednesday June 2, 2010.

While "Star Trek" introduced him to a different group of fans, Stewart is also a widely respected stage actor.

The 69-year-old actor discovered the [theater](#) as a child, and said "my heroes were Sir Laurence Olivier, Sir John Gielgud, Sir Alec Guinness. Being in that company is the grandest thing that has professionally happened to me." Stewart joined Britain's storied Royal Shakespeare Company in his 20s, and in 2008 was nominated for a Tony award for the leading role in "Macbeth."

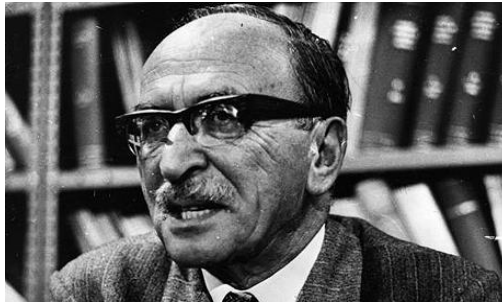

## Dennis Gabor won the Nobel Prize for Physics in 1971

The Hungarian-born electrical engineer won the Nobel Prize for Physics in 1971 for an invention of a system of lenseless, three-dimensional photography that has many applications.

He moved from Hungary to Germany as a young man and from 1927 was a research engineer for the firm of Siemens and Halske in Berlin.

In 1933 Gabor - who was Jewish - fled Nazi Germany for Britain.

He worked with the Thomson-Houston Company in England, later becoming a British citizen.

In 1947 he conceived the idea of holography and, by employing conventional filtered-light sources, developed the basic technique. In 1949 Gabor joined the faculty of London's Imperial College of Science and Technology. In 1958 he became professor of applied electron physics. His other work included research on high-speed oscilloscopes, communication theory, physical optics, and television. Gabor was awarded more than 100 patents.

He died in London on 8 February 1979, aged 78.

Every night, Kenney said, the crew would "put that little piece of denim in a drawer and pray it wouldn't shrink up."

After sharing other memories of his time on the show and answering questions, Kenney autographed photographs.

According to Vice Regional Coordinator Douglas Mayo, who has been involved in Starfleet since 1989, the organization has been holding its annual summit for the past 10 years at the Hampshire Inn, which he called "an ideal location."

In addition to Star Trek enthusiasts, Starfleet welcomes all sci-fi fans.

"It's a group of like-minded people," Mayo said. "Whether it's Anime, Stargate, Battlestar Galactica, you name it, It's a really tight-knit group," he continued.

According to Mayo, the organization participates in a number of charities in addition to celebrating a shared love of science fiction.

Regional Coordinator Thomas Guertin said he has made friends with fellow "Star Trek" enthusiasts all over the world thanks to Starfleet.

"That's why I stay," he said. "The friendships I've made are unbelievable."

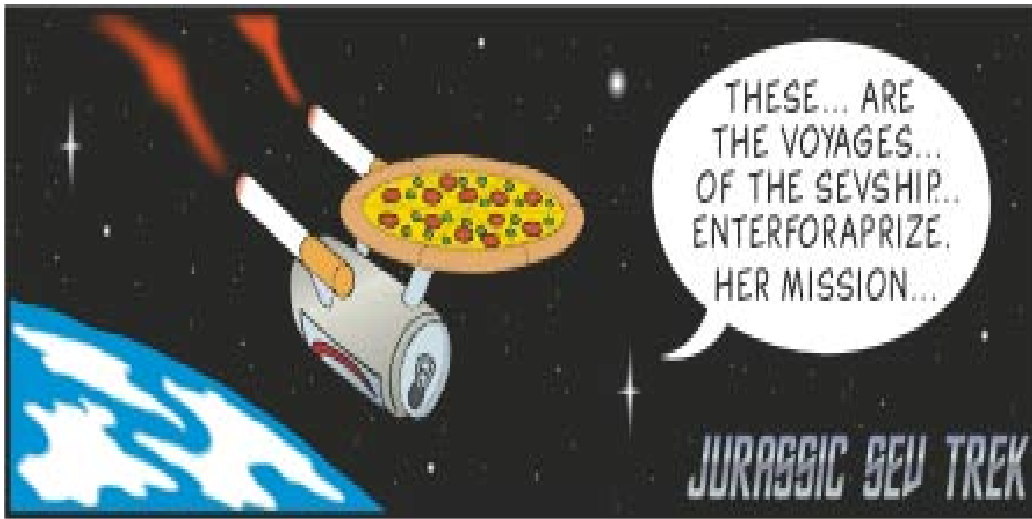
Paul Fest, who heads the USS Starfleet Ares out of Boston, said he enjoys the community aspect of the festivities as well.
