From the Principal's Office

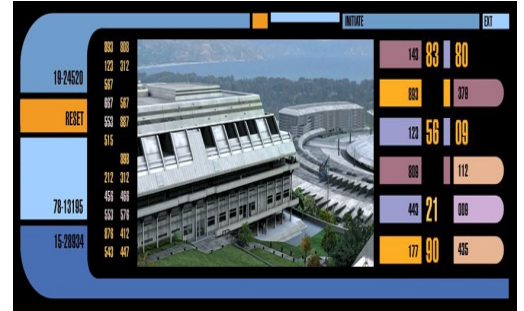

The STARFLEET Academy Orientation College (SAOC) presents all of the instructions and Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) developed over time for students wishing to take courses at STARFLEET Academy and for Directors and Deans to administer their Colleges and Institutes.

Each level will be sent out as a unit, when the application is received.

Prerequisites

Successful completion of the entire 100-level curriculum is the prerequisite for taking courses in the 200-level curriculum and successful completion of the entire 200-level curriculum is the prerequisite for taking courses in the 300-level curriculum.

The prerequisite procedure will inform every participant in the Academy experience of the Standard Operating Procedures (SOP) and rules at each level.

100 Level: Student Orientation

The four courses in this level cover all aspects of taking courses through STARFLEET Academy.

SAOC-101 - Rules and Regulations
SAOC-102 - How to Take a Course, Part 1
SAOC-103 - How to Take a Course, Part 2

200 Level: Director Orientation

The seven courses in this level cover all aspects of directing a College at STARFLEET Academy. Prerequisite: Completion of all courses in the 100-Level.

SAOC-202 - Exam Format and SOP, Part 1
SAOC-203 - Exam Format and SOP, Part 2
SAOC-204 - Reporting SOP, Part 1

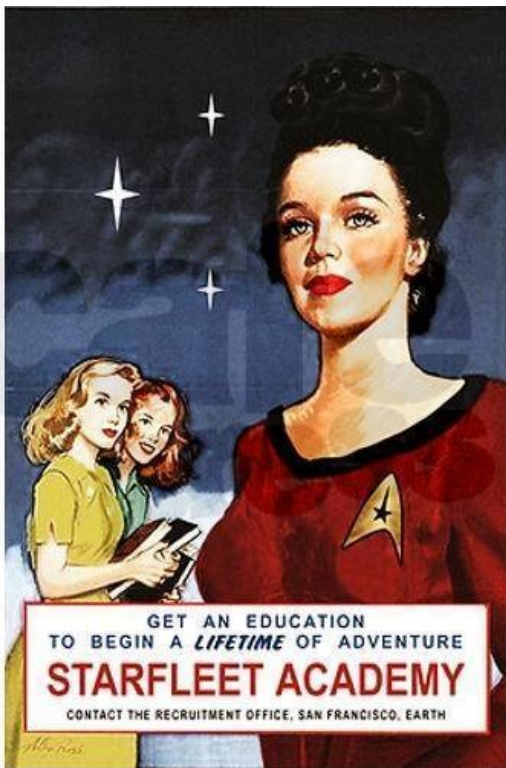

SO YOU WANT TO BE A DIRECTOR



Basic requirements are: Be at least 18 years of age and have taken OTS and OCC. Cadets at least 14 years of age may serve with an adult mentor.

To assume a vacancy, you must pass all of the exams in the College, or if a College of 35 to 60 exams, 75% of the exams. Colleges over 60 exams are tested out at 50%, with a maximum of 50 exams required.

Assistant Directors must meet the same requirements as the Director.

To direct a College of your own creation, first check the College Catalogue to make certain your idea is not already being used.

If the concept is not being used elsewhere, submit a College outline, exam, and key to the Course Development Contact, Carol Thompson at: betazoid@mosquionet.com

She will determine where your College fits within the Academy structure and introduce you to your Dean, who will lead you through the approval process.

REMEMBERING GRACE LEE WHITNEY

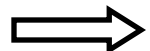


StarTrek.com is deeply saddened to report the passing of Grace Lee Whitney, who played Yeoman Janice Rand on [Star Trek: The Original Series](#), in several of the *TOS* features and also on [Star Trek: Voyager](#). According to her family, the actress and singer died on May 1 at the age of 85, passing away peacefully in her home in Coarsegold, California.

Whitney, a blue-eyed blond beauty, represented one of *Star Trek's* greatest cautionary tales and also one of the franchise's most satisfying renaissance stories. She played the deeply professional Rand in eight first-season *TOS* episodes before being dropped from the series and slipping into an abyss of drugs and alcohol that left her, quite literally, on Hollywood's Skid Row. She finally got help, found God, and reclaimed her life and career, with an assist from *Leonard Nimoy*.

Star Trek even came full circle for Whitney, as she was invited back into the fold and appeared in *The Motion Picture*, *The Search for Spock*, *The Voyage Home*, and *The Undiscovered Country*, as well as in the "[Flashback](#)" episode of *Voyager* and the fan films "World Enough and Time" and "Of Gods and Men."

Her revealing autobiography, *The Longest Trek: My Tour of the Galaxy*, was published in 1998 and, to her death, she remained a beloved figure at *Star Trek* conventions around the world. Beyond the realm of *Star Trek*, Whitney's credits included the Broadway show *Top Banana*, such films as *Some Like It Hot* and *Irma la Douce* and also many TV guest spots on shows including, *The Outer Limits*, *Death Valley Days*, *Bonanza*, *The Rifleman*, *Bewitched* and the pilot for *Police Story*, which also featured the talents of Gene Roddenberry and DeForest Kelley.

StarTrek.com interviewed the vivacious Whitney in 2011, and she had this to say about the early days of playing Rand. "I was supposed to be innocent, dedicated, excellent in my motives for wanting to be on the Enterprise, but very green, with no experience. Rand was willing to learn to be a secretary to the captain, whom, of course, I immediately had a crush on. But, it was unrequited love, like Kitty and Matt on *Gunsmoke*. It could not be consummated. It had to be love from afar, an unrequited love between the captain and me."

Back in 2011, when *StarTrek.com* interviewed Whitney, she spoke excitedly of living on a 30-acre property near Yosemite National Park, with a running creek, and helping to care for her grandchildren. "(My son) Jonathan built a home down at the end of my property, where he lives with his family, including my grandchildren," she enthused. "They're going to take care of me as I move through life to my home in heaven. But right now I take my grandchildren to school and cart them around, and I'm of maximum service to them... I also line dance one night a week and I go to the gym three days a week. So, my life is happy, joyous, free, sober and saved, and a lot of fun, too. I have a lot of fun."

ZACHARY PAYS TRIBUTE TO LEONARD

The younger Spock has joined the **chorus of condolences** for Leonard Nimoy. Zachary Quinto, who portrayed the "Star Trek" character Nimoy made famous in two movies directed by J.J. Abrams, **posted a shot of his predecessor** on Instagram alongside a heartfelt caption that quotes "Hamlet" and mourns the loss of his "dear friend."

Quinto and Nimoy made regular appearances together once the 37-year-old actor was cast as Spock. The duo did press ahead of 2009's "Star Trek," appearing at San Diego Comic-Con and on talk shows. Quinto, Nimoy and Chris Pine popped up during "Weekend Update" on a Justin Timbelake-hosted episode of "Saturday Night Live" the same year. Nimoy also cameoed in the first "Star Trek," and he and Quinto co-starred in a car commercial in 2013.

Sir Patrick Stewart has company. Joan Collins, beloved by [Star Trek](#) fans for her role as Edith Keeler in "[The City on the Edge of Forever](#)," and perhaps best known for playing the imperious Alexis Carrington on *Dynasty*, is now a dame. The actress was made the female equivalent of a knight in Queen Elizabeth II's annual New Year's honors list.



Collins, a longtime advocate of nonprofit children's charities, was recognized for her services to such groups. The British actress said of her honor that it was "humbling to receive this level of recognition from my queen and country, and I am thrilled and truly grateful."





DR STEPHEN HAWKING



Dr. Stephen Hawking -- the man, the legend, the scientist so respected and beloved that he played a holographic version of himself, a man amongst geniuses, in the "[Descent, Part 1](#)" episode of [Star Trek: The Next Generation](#) -- turns 73 years old.

[StarTrek.com](#)'s *One Trek Mind* writer, Jordan Hoffman, described Dr. Hawking as follows: "He is so fascinating that if he came up in fiction one might think it were far-fetched. Here is one of the most advanced minds in the world, and yet he is trapped inside a broken body. Communicating through mechanical means (a speech system that could be updated, but is retained for idiosyncratic reasons), Professor Hawking's brilliant insights into Cosmology ring with a robotic quality. His voice is without question the most recognizable of any scientist living today -- though it isn't actually his voice."

Some Hawking tidbits to consider:

- Listen carefully to latter-day *Star Trek* and more than once mention is made of a shuttlecraft called the Hawking.
- Hawking is the only person to play himself or herself (or a holographic version) on any incarnation of *Star Trek*.
- In the *TNG* series finale, "[All Good Things...](#)," Data (in an alternate future) holds the Lucasian Chair of mathematics at Cambridge University. Why such a specific reference? Dr. Hawking held that same position from 1979 to 2009. And, by the way, Sir Isaac Newton, Data and Hawking's holographic poker competition, held the position from 1669 to 1702.
- Dr. Hawking followed in the footsteps of several popular *Trek* figures, including Wil Wheaton and Leonard Nimoy, by guest starring on *The Big Bang Theory*. Dr. Hawking played himself in the episode, which aired in April, 2012.
- The name "Hawking" appeared on a list of vocabulary words on a screen in Keiko O'Brien's classroom in the "[In the Hands of the Prophets](#)" episode of [Deep Space Nine](#).
- Speaking of *DS9*, Dr. Hawking visited the set of the show during the production of the episode "[The House of Quark](#)."
- And here's a question for you... What do Khan and Dr. Hawking have in common? Would you believe... Benedict Cumberbatch. The red-hot actor, who played Khan in [Star Trek Into Darkness](#), starred as Dr. Hawking in a 2004 British television movie titled *Hawking*.





Online Study Skills Workshop

Being an academic coach as an undergrad really changed my life. Besides learning skills that helped me to perform better, I was able to impart those same skills to the students I worked with. This semester I have a class that has an actual midterm, something I haven't encountered for a year and half, so I found myself wondering if I still knew how to study for it.

I went in search for a site that offered a way for me to brush up those skills, and decided once I found it to share it with all of you. These are tips that can help students of all levels, but they can also help anyone with time management skills and learn to read more effectively. When you arrive at the site you'll find four online study skill workshops.

Time Management Strategies – this is an important section and one of the first things I would cover with a student. A lot of students, myself included, are excellent at procrastinating. But if you discover what your schedule is like and plot it out so that you can see if in front of you, set goals that make you want to work to accomplish your task, and schedule time for relaxation you'll become a lot more efficient. I would start by reading the introduction and see if you identify with the what is being described, if so head down and take the quiz. Then check out all the categories you can click into. Also if you're not a student, consider replacing school with work and studying with tasks.

Improving Test Performance – this section is definitely geared towards students (as it should be), I'd suggest starting by taking the quiz, and seeing what the assessment is. Then check out the test taking strategies and study strategies offered.

SQ3R Improving Reading Comprehension – this section breaks down the SQ3R method step by step. Learn to Survey, Question, Read, Recite, and Review. You'll also learn why these are effective tools for increasing your reading comprehension. I also really like that they've given a guide line of when it's appropriate to use this method.

Improving Concentration and Memory – this is my favorite section! It shows you how to setup a conducive environment to get the most studying done, utilizes structure and organization, and brings in memory improvement techniques.

I hope you'll give these workshops a try and see how you can improve your time management, reading comprehension, and memory!

VOYAGER "DEATH WISH" 19 YEARS LATER

"[Death Wish](#)," one of [Star Trek: Voyager](#)'s edgiest and most-controversial episodes, aired 19 years ago on February 19, 1996. The story follows a Q named Quinn, played by Gerrit Graham, who seeks asylum aboard Voyager... so that he can commit suicide in order to end the tedium he's endured as an immortal being. Also involved are Q (John de Lancie) and William T. Riker (Jonathan Frakes), with Q attempting to defend the Q Continuum and Riker called upon to share how his life was profoundly changed by Q's influence.

Here are some facts and anecdotes about "Death Wish" --

**Kate Mulgrew lobbied hard to have De Lancie appear on *Voyager*, despite the concerns of the writers and producers about how to include the character without it seeming he only ever appeared on the starships from current *Star Trek* shows.

**Mulgrew hosted a dinner that included De Lancie and his wife and *Voyager* executive producer Rick Berman and his wife. And during that evening the actress directly implored Berman to find a way to beam Q aboard *Voyager*. The a-ha moment for bringing Q to *Voyager* came courtesy of Shawn Piller, co-executive producer Michael Piller's son, who was then in his early 20s. Shawn suggested the idea of another Q serving as the impetus for De Lancie's Q to appear on the ship. Shawn pitched the writers' room, the concept took hold, and father and son wrote the teleplay together.

**Graham, prior to his *Voyager* guest turn, had played a Hunter in the *Deep Space Nine* episode "[Captive Pursuit](#)."

**Maury Ginsberg was portrayed by... Maury Ginsberg. The producers liked the actor's name and retained it for the character.

**The episode ran long, resulting in the trimming of some scenes and the full excision of a conversation between Harry Kim and Tom Paris in Kim's quarters. The scene didn't go to waste, however. It was later included in "[The Thaw](#)."

**6.8 million viewers watched "Death Wish," the second-highest ratings numbers of any season-two episode, behind only "[The 37's](#)." Interestingly, James L. Conway directed both episodes.

**"Death Wish" was full of ironies for Conway. It was down to him and Frakes to direct [First Contact](#), and Patrick Stewart chose his close friend Frakes. Yet, there he was on "Death Wish," directing Frakes. And there's more, as Conway recounted during a conversation with [StarTrek.com](#) a few years ago. "That was my first time with John de Lancie, and he's a delight," he said. "Gerrit Graham was great, too. John is a wonderful raconteur and a wonderful actor, and he had that character down. Q was such a wonderful character. A year or two later I did the video game with John, *Star Trek: Borg*, which was shot at the same time as the movie Jonathan was directing, which was another irony of that whole thing."





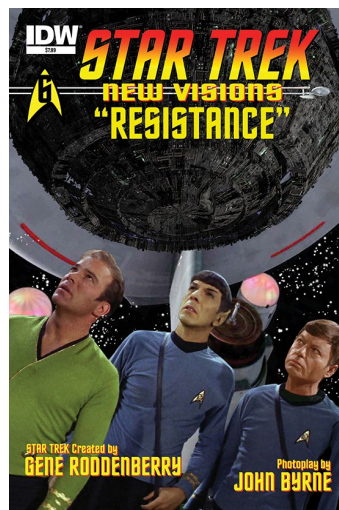
