Starfleet Sciences is an informational resource within the old Fleet Resource Center concept which promotes science education and explores the portrayal of science within the Star Trek shows. Starfleet Sciences has a [web site](#) which includes a Chief Science Officer Handbook; in the past month, the number of hits to the web page increased 38 to 5466. Starfleet Sciences also has a listserv and Facebook page; the Facebook page has 2590 lifetime total likes and 847 daily total impressions for September. A [Pinterest board](#) of science-related events by region is available. A Stellar Cartography department, with Capt. Michael Krogh ([mkrogh@mail.com](mailto:mkrogh@mail.com)) at its head, has a goal to promote amateur astronomy through information, advice and communication. Stellar Cartography's [Facebook page](#). Starfleet Sciences Director Richard Heim and wife are safe and healthy, continuing to shelter at home, to escape the novel corona virus COVID-19, and teleworking; the end of September was especially busy at work, with Richard attending 3 days of virtual conferences and one Twitter Chat. Director Heim successfully completed the SFA courses SFDPP 101 and 102. Starfleet Sciences receives reports from the regional science officers or liaisons in seven regions (1, 7, 8, 9, 11, 13, and 15). Region One Sciences (also led by Adm. Heim) was active with five ships reporting in September, and Region 7's Comm. Held summarized many new developments in the field of astronomy and space exploration reported by the USS Sovereign. Comm. Held's summary included reports on: scientists probe the weird alien water inside of Uranus and Neptune; winds and tides drive sea waves on Titan; Did a supernova cause Earth's mass extinction 360 million years ago?; Mars lander InSight picks up tiny ground tilt caused by Phobos moon transit; the origin of Earth's water; Earth's core is a billion years old; the Moon is rusty, and it's likely Earth's fault; Jupiter might have up to 600 moons; to find life on Venus, check for spores in the atmosphere; and could an unexplained strange chemical in clouds of Venus be a sign of life? September posts to the Starfleet Sciences Facebook page covered such topics as: multiple posts on what we can learn from the Influenza Pandemic of 1918-19 and lessons for COVID-19; Hacking Your Mind (we imagine our conscious minds make most decisions but in reality we go through much of our lives on "autopilot", and others can take advantage of us through that); 'Oumuamua might be a shard of a broken planet; Saturn's auroras may explain the planet's weirdly hot upper atmosphere; climate change made a southwestern U.S. drought one of the worst in 1,200 years; Fifth U.S. National Climate Assessment; Global State of the Climate in 2019; ancient "pickled" leaves give a glimpse of Global Greening; and Region One and Starfleet Sciences reports announcements; as well as Science Shows on TV This Week. The most popular post was 'Oumuamua might be a shard of a broken planet, viewed by 57 people, followed by Science Shows on TV (53) and Hacking Your Mind (52).

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A lot has happened in the last month since my last report to you. CQ204 was released and the annual ECAB Meeting occurred.

Social Media Services still reports that there are still people not following the guidelines set to admit members to our Facebook, mailing lists and other social media outlets we oversee.

Remember, those who are subscribing to either our Facebook pages or mailing lists, that any Commanding Officer who invites members of their chapter to these social media accounts should make it known to their members that requests made for information need to be made out in full without exception.

These requests for information are in compliance with the GDPR regulations of the European Union and our own SFDPP (STARFLEET Data Protection Policy). These points must be emphasized in your invitations for your membership. Failure to do this will result in those memberships for our social media accounts to be denied and attempted to contact you about those denials be made by our Social Media Representatives. It will be up to you to communicate this to your membership, as our workers are stretch by not only whether to accept or deny certain who failed to comply with the requests of information, but also moderate said social media platforms.

## CES OFFICE

Good day from the CES. I would like to say that review of courses is progressing. I have been having the staff push back if the review date is not on the courses and manual. I have also asked my staff to push for more colleges to be done.

SFMCA is still working on their courses and manuals and they are on Moodle as PDF. The SFMCA works with TRACOM and me to get this done.

Everyone on staff in SFMCA and SFA have completed the SFDPP courses. Those that have not completed has been put on suspension until the end of October. If they do not complete, then they are removed from Staff. Any new people wanting to join the Staff will have 30 days to complete the SFDPP.

Now on to some other news

## SFA NEWS

This month our numbers dipped slightly, but hopefully they will pick up again soon. The number of completed courses was just short of 1900, and there were just over 150 individual students (not counting SFDPP). Some of the decrease may be due to some college Directors choosing to close their colleges temporarily while completing their revisions.

The SFDPP tracker created by TJ shows that we have just over 640 members who have taken at least one of the two courses, and most have taken both of course. We are doing our best to keep this updated for those who need access, and this includes looking up each student and inputting their region by hand. When a mistake in a region for a member was reported, we did go in and check all of the entries at that time for accuracy, but there may still be errors. If an error is found, we do apologize, and ask that you email me privately with the details so I can get them fixed. Access to our tracker must be approved by CES TJ Allen, but either Carol or myself is happy to look up any member for verification if asked by someone who has proper authority.

More colleges have completed their revisions and updates, and we have staff and non-staff members volunteering to help those who have not finished. We are also working to reopen some colleges that are currently closed, and those courses will of course not reopen unless they are up to date.

We have currently put a hold on submissions to the Course Development Committee, as we have quite a few in the queue and need to get those processed. We have at least one new college set to open soon, and several new and/or completely rewritten courses being added to existing colleges.

We are preparing for the window of time (December/January) in which we are allowed to move/merge courses, split courses, etc. One thing that will take place during that time is the closure of the Institute of Cadet Studies. The courses from that institute that are still viable will be moving to be with their “adult” counterparts. We will still be serving our cadets and disabled members, but those courses will be located in the regular colleges rather than in separate colleges. This will enable us to free up some staff members for other duties. We will also be merging a few colleges that are similar in nature, so that we can reduce the number of staff positions needing to be filled. Lastly, we will be merging the Institute of Alternative Medicine with the Institute of Medical Arts. All of the colleges and staff from Alternative Medicine will simply be relocated.

### **SFMCA NEWS**

This has been an interesting month or two. We've been working very hard to get our numbers and our programs up to speed before the end of the month. MECHA, NCO, INF and PD have all been in the process updating manuals and submitting them for approval for disbursement among the SFMC population
