

### D) Purpose

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The SFI-L mailing list is an official mailing list that allows members of STARFLEET to easily exchange ideas and information as well as discuss policy of STARFLEET. This list is NOT a roleplaying or persona list. This list is owned and operated by the Chief of Computer Operations, STARFLEET and administered by the list moderators.

Announcements of upcoming chapter and Regional events are welcome, as well as discussions about policy and membership issues. Topics not allowed are dealing with religion, sex, real world controversies and other topics as determined by the list moderators.

The authority of the list owner as well as the list moderators, is controlled by the rules in this FAQ, but is not limited to only the rules in this FAQ. You are asked to abide by the rules set forth in this FAQ as well as requests made by the Moderators on the list itself.

The right to free speech guaranteed within the United States by the first amendment to the Constitution of the United States applies to the United States Government limiting your right of expression. It does not apply to private individuals or organizations and does not apply to sfi-l. Your continued privilege of posting to this list is dependent upon your appropriate use of it.

E) How to Post

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To post a message to SFI-L, send an E-mail to sfi-l@lists.sfi.org

Your entire header (including, for example, To, CC, Subject) must not be longer than 1024 characters to conform to limitations in the mailing list software in use.

Your subject line should be brief, but descriptive. A subject line of "question" isn't informative, but a subject line of "where can I find the rules about Corry Ops" would be better

In order for the list to know who they are talking to, all messages must be signed with, at minimum, an identifying name and E-mail address. Keep your signature line to 5 or 6 lines, maximum. This is for the benefit of members that are on digest mode, and to help minimize the size of digests.

Check the recipients of your replies. If you plan on sending a private reply check that the correct E-mail address is in your TO: field.

Rich text and HTML formatted messages are discouraged. These types of messages may not be formatted correctly and can contain a virus. Please only send messages to this list in plain text.

Attachments are prohibited on this list. The list software has been set to reject messages over a certain size to stop attachments from getting through. If you have something that you wish to make available to the members of the list, please post that it is available and that you will send it upon request or that it is available for download from a website.

This is a closed list. When you post, make sure that you post from the E-mail address that is subscribed. E-mail from any non-subscribed E-mail address will be rejected.

You are required to act in a professional manner on this list. While dissent is encouraged, you should make every effort to express this in a polite manner. Stating that "if that person were to state that the sky is blue, I would go to the window to make sure, because I don't trust him to tell the truth" would be inappropriate, as that would be a personal attack. However, if that was worded such as "I always seek to verify information that I have been given before accepting it' would be better.

## F) To post or Not to post

Before you send a message remember that you are about to send your thoughts to a list subscribed by many people. If you're mad when you write your post, hold onto it for a few hours, and re-read it. You may decide to revise before sending or not send at all.

See the section on "What not to do" before posting to make sure that you are not violating a list rule before posting.

G) Replies,	follow ups,	and quoting

When replying to a message ask yourself the following question: Does the list need to see my reply, or should it only go to the person that sent the original message? If this is the case, make sure to change the To field to that of the sender.

When sending a reply remember that the list has already seen the message that your replying to. You don't need the entire message in your reply. Simply remove any part of the message that you are replying to, and add your comments.

## H) When things go wrong

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If you believe that there is something wrong with the list, please contact the list moderators, don't test it for yourself. This also applies to testing your filters. Please leave the operation and testing of the list to the moderators.

If there's nothing wrong with the list but you have a complaint about something that was posted, please contact the moderators. Most of our activity is done in private. Since we moderate in private, please contact us privately as your issue may have already been dealt with. It is also possible that we haven't received a complaint yet and you may be alerting us to a potential problem.

If you're going to be away from your E-mail for a period of time or your E-mail account is going to be unreachable for a period of time, please either consider unsubscribing or set your subscription setting to digest mode. A full or unreachable E-mail box will generate a bounce notice to the mail software and a large number of bounces can cause you to be unsubscribed from this list. Also, please do not have auto-responders set up on the E-mail address subscribed to this list.

#### I) What not to do

No profanity will be allowed on the list. If you unsure whether a word is considered profane, do not use it. If you test this rule by intentionally (in the opinion of any moderator) using a word just to see if it will result in moderation, you will be moderated.

As in generally accepted in netiquette circles, the following is a list of things that are prohibited on this list:

\*No flames or trolling will be allowed on this list. Flaming is defined as the act of posting messages that are purposely hostile and derogative. Trolling is a the act of making a post in order to provoke an angry response or to start trouble without adding anything worthwhile to the conversation.

\*No forwarding of private mail. Messages sent to you privately are not to be shared with the list without the permission of the author. The same applies to messages from a limited access mailing list, unless the message is clearly marked "Cross Post as Necessary". Always seek permission first and if in doubt, please contact a moderator first.

- \*No forwarding of messages to the list from non-subscribers or subscribers on moderation. If someone asks you to forward their thoughts to the list, please have them contact a list moderator. If we think it's appropriate, we will forward it to the list for them.
- \*No posting of copyrighted material without permission. If the material is something that is of interest, feel free to post a link to the material.
- \*No excessive quoting. Do not include the entire original message at the beginning or end of your message ether. Simply remove any part of the original that you are not commenting on. Be thoughtful of those set to digest mode.
- \*No unmarked spoilers. While this type of posting is not appropriate for this list, if you must send a spoiler, make sure to leave at least 20 blank lines and mark your subject as a spoiler.
- \*No chain letters. Any message that asks to you send this to all your friends is a chain letter.
- \*No virus warnings. If you believe that you have a warning that just has to be sent to this list, please contact a list moderator about it. We will review it and if it is real and we determine that it should be sent, we will post it.
- \*No test messages. This includes messages to simply test your filters.
- \*No commercial non-STARFLEET related advertising or commercial sales pitches. This does not include the STARFLEET Quartermaster or chapters trying to raise money for a their charity, a Regional Summit, IC or other strictly STARFLEET related event.
- \*No "Me Too" posts.
- \*No personal paging without permission of the list moderators.
- \*Limit signature blocks to six lines, including all information, decorations, quotations and blank lines.
- \*Don't post replies to the list when you really only meant to send to one person. Check your to fields prior to sending your message.
- \*No attachments. No stylized text, no HTML messages.

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If you are warned by a moderator not to do something, please respect that. Failure to follow directions from the moderator can and will, result in punishment. While the STARFLEET Membership Handbook guarantees the Right to voice your opinion at any

level of STARFLEET, this is not an absolute right to participate in this forum. You have the right to contact the leadership of the organization at any time. This list is not your only method. Repeated failure to abide by the rules can and usually will result in moderation or suspension from the list.

Typically, the first violation will result in a warning. Continued violation will result in a one week moderation. If, after that moderation is served, continued violation will result in a longer moderation, as determined appropriate by the moderators. Continued violations will result in the moderators contacting the list owner to determine if a suspension from the list is warranted or a complete banning from the list. While we will strive to follow the progression of punishments, we reserve the right to jump to a later one, based on the facts surrounding the punishment.

While you are moderated, your posts will be rejected by the list moderators. You will still receive posts from the list, but you will not be allowed to respond to the list. While we realize that not everyone checks their E-mail constantly, we do expect that our closure to be respected. The members of the list will be given a 4 hour grace period if a normal delivery subscriber and 12 hours if you are on digest mode. You will also be given one post on a closed topic (and receive a private warning) before receiving a moderation or suspension. You, the list members, are expected to follow the rules and make sure that no threads have been closed prior to posting.

Article 1, Section 1 of the STARFLEET Constitution defines two categories of STARFLEET members: Active Duty and Associate.

#### **Active Duty Membership**

Active Duty members of STARFLEET are those individuals who choose to participate in the futuristic atmosphere provided by the chapters of STARFLEET, as well as the atmosphere created by the unique infrastructure of the organization. Active duty members are entitled to sign aboard the STARFLEET chapter of their choice and hold a fictional rank within the organization. Active duty members may also choose to become involved in operations and activities or hold a position of responsibility at the Chapter, Regional, and International levels.

Enclosed with your new membership packet is a Membership card. This card affords proof of your membership in STARFLEET, as well as documenting important information about you, including your name, address, and STARFLEET Security Clearance Code (SCC) number, and membership expiration date.

Also enclosed in your packet is a current edition of the Vessel Registry, which lists all currently active chapters of STARFLEET. You may elect to join any chapter of

STARFLEET, near or far, and participate in whatever fashion is acceptable to both you and the Commanding Officer of your chosen chapter. In order to join, send your completed Request for Assignment card and a SASE to the CO of your chapter of choice. Please note that some chapters charge additional dues over those levied by STARFLEET.

STARFLEET policy dictates that you can officially belong to the roster of only one chapter at a time, in order to allow STARFLEET Headquarters to efficiently track memberships and chapter crew strengths. This chapter is known as your Primary Chapter. However, members are free to participate in the activities of chapters other than that which they are primarily assigned to. Should you ever wish to transfer your Primary Chapter membership from one chapter to another, simply inform both of the COs involved and the Office of the Chief of Computer Operations, STARFLEET in order to make the necessary updates to the STARFLEET Database and crew rosters. Change of Chapter forms are available from the documents section of the STARFLEET web site.

When you renew your membership in STARFLEET, you will also be provided with a membership Request for Assignment card, containing the same information as the card for new members. This card serves as proof of your membership renewal and should be given to your CO upon receipt for the chapter's records.

### **Associate Membership**

Associate members choose not to participate in the fictional aspects of STARFLEET, and therefore do not receive a position aboard a chapter or a fictional rank within the organization. Associate Members will receive all membership materials, as well as the Communiqué. If at any time an Associate member wishes to become an Active Duty member, he or she should simply advise the Chief of Computer Operations, STARFLEET in writing of their choice of chapter assignment and then follow the guidelines above for new Active Duty members choosing a chapter.

Also enclosed in your packet is the most recently printed copy of the Vessel Registry, which lists all currently active chapters of STARFLEET(A newer version may be available on the STARFLEET website). You may elect to join any chapter of STARFLEET, near or far, and participate in whatever fashion is acceptable to both you

and the Commanding Officer of your chosen chapter. Please note that some chapters charge additional dues over those levied by STARFLEET. If you did not request assignment to a chapter when you filled out your application you can request assignment to the chapter of your choice by contacting Member Services Helpdesk and the Chapter CO.

STARFLEET policy dictates that you can officially belong to the roster of only one chapter at a time, in order to allow STARFLEET Headquarters to efficiently track memberships and chapter crew strengths. This chapter is known as your Primary Chapter. However, members are free to participate in the activities of chapters other than that which they are primarily assigned to. Should you ever wish to transfer your Primary Chapter membership from one chapter to another, simply inform both of the COs involved and the Member Services Helpdesk in order to make the necessary updates to the STARFLEET Database and crew rosters. Change of Chapter forms are available from the documents section of the STARFLEET web site.

### **Associate Membership**

Associate members (Also referred to as unassigned) choose not to participate in the fictional aspects of STARFLEET, and therefore do not receive a position aboard a chapter or a fictional rank within the organization. Associate Members will receive all membership materials, as well as the Communiqué. If at any time an Associate member wishes to become an Active Duty member, he or she should simply advise the Member Services Helpdesk of their choice of chapter assignment and then follow the guidelines above for new Active Duty members choosing a chapter.

#### Section 04:09 - THE STARFLEET SHAKEDOWN PROGRAM

The STARFLEET Shakedown Program was developed as a "training course" for individuals and chapters that aspire to become official chapters of STARFLEET and receive a chapter charter. Typically, new chapters of STARFLEET form for a variety of reasons: distance from a currently active chapter, specific needs of a group of members, cultural or philosophical differences, etc. When a group of members comes together and decides to form a chapter, the STARFLEET Shakedown Program is designed to help those members become an active, growing, and prosperous chapter of STARFLEET.

Chapters in the Shakedown Program function as chapters-in-training under the tutelage of already-established chapters, referred to as Support Ships. The following conditions must be met before a new chapter-in-training can be formed:

- The crew must consist of at least five active STARFLEET members, including the CO and XO. Only individual memberships or up to two (2) members per family membership count toward this minimum.
- The CO and XO must have taken and passed the STARFLEET Officer Training School (OTS) exam.
- Authorization must have been received from the Department of Technical Services for the vessel name, NCC/SFR number, and starship/station class and type. (Note that during the Shakedown Program, chapters-in-training will use NX/SFX prefixes.)
- Both the Commanding Officer and Executive Officer must be at least 18 years of age.

Since there may be some Shakedown chapters that are not on the internet and some that are, there are two ways to submit a VRR package: 1) via the Postal Service and 2) electronically.

#### 1) Postal Service:

Once the above requirements have been met, the Shakedown Chapter CO must place the following in an envelope:

- A completed and signed Vessel Registration Request (VRR) form.
- A copy of the CO's and XO's Officer Training School (OTS) Certificates.
- A copy of the DTS vessel approval letter.
- A check or money order for the current shakedown chapter fee made out to STARFLEET (if applicable). Contact Chief of Shakedown Operations, STARFLEET to verify.
- Two Self-Addressed, Stamped Envelopes one addressed to the RC and the other to the Chief of Shakedown Operations.

This package is then sent to the CO of the Support Chapter, who will add his/her signature to the VRR and forward the entire package to the Regional Coordinator. Your region may also ask you to send a copy of this VRR to the Regional ShOC officers. Should the vessel reside in a Region outside of the Region of their Support Chapter, the Regional Coordinator of both the vessel's Region and the Support Chapter's region must receive and sign all paperwork during the shakedown period. Once the Regional Coordinator(s) signs the VRR, he/she will forward the package to the Chief of Shakedown Operations, STARFLEET.

#### 2) Electronically:

For an electronic submission of the launch VRR, the following process is followed:

- The prospective Chapter-in-Training gets vessel approval, via e-mail, from DTS.
- The prospective Chapter-in-Training gets the OTS eligibility information via the STARFLEET Database or has a copy of the certificates which can be emailed as an attachment.
- The VRR PDF file is downloaded printed and is filled out by the prospective CO. The filled-out VRR is scanned
  and then e-mailed to the official e-mail addresses of the Support Chapter CO, the RC (both RCs if the Support
  Chapter is in a different Region), any Regional ShOC officers that may request it, and the Chief of Shakedown
  Operations, STARFLEET.
- After each person has signed the VRR, he/she scans it and sends it via e-mail attachment to the next person on the VRR distribution list. The DTS approval e-mail and the OTS eligibility information or certificates are attached to this e-mail.
- When the final approval is issued by Shakedown Operations Command, the Shakedown Chapter is launched.

Once Shakedown Operations has received and verified the package, they will formally launch the chapter-in-training and promote the CO to the grade of O-5 and the XO to the grade of O-4 (provided they do not already hold those grades or higher).

Chapters-in-training in the Shakedown Program perform activities and operations much like a commissioned chapter of STARFLEET. Reports must be filed on a monthly basis with the Support Ship CO, the RC(s), and the Chief of Shakedown Operations, STARFLEET. During their time in the Shakedown Program, the crew is encouraged to begin developing operational procedures, newsletters, recruiting, and other activities normally performed by STARFLEET chapters.

The Shakedown Program will take new chapters-in-training of STARFLEET a minimum of 9 months to complete, but may take longer if appropriate and necessary. The typical period to complete the Shakedown Program is from 9 to 12 months in time.

#### Section 04:10 - ACCELERATED SHAKEDOWN PROGRAM

The Accelerated Shakedown Program (ASP) is designed to reflect the fact that some groups seeking to become STARFLEET chapters already possess some of the characteristics which the standard Shakedown Program is designed to help groups to gain.

In simpler terms, some groups, whether they be a new group comprised of long-time members who have "been there and done that", or a group that has been together already for a while (e.g., either an independent club seeking to become a Starfleet chapter or a former chapter seeking to return to the organization after a period away), would need a shorter period of time to become acclimated to functioning as a current Starfleet chapter than would a newly-forming group composed of members new to running a club.

In such a situation, it may be reasonable to grant a shorter shakedown cruise. A series of key metrics was established by which Shakedown Operations Command could determine whether a group could qualify for a shortened shakedown period. More details can be found in the START manual, or by contacting Shakedown Operations Command. Even under ASP, however, the minimum shakedown period is 5 months.

#### Section 04:11 - THE STARFLEET CHAPTER PROGRAM

Within the space of a year (typically between nine and twelve months), the crew of the Shakedown Program chapter may submit another VRR form to request to become a chartered chapter. In order to be commissioned as a chartered chapter, the following conditions must be met immediately prior to commissioning:

- The crew must consist of at least ten active STARFLEET members, including the CO and XO. Only individual memberships or up to three (3) members per family membership count toward this minimum.
- The CO and XO must have taken and passed the Officer Command College (OCC) exam.
- Authorization must have been received from the Department of Technical Services for the ship name, NCC/SFR number, and starship/station class and type. (The original authorization can be used here, if the group has not changed their vessel.)

Since there may be some Shakedown chapters that are not on the internet and some that are, there are two ways to submit a VRR package: 1) via the Postal Service and 2) electronically.

#### 1) Postal Service

Once the above requirements have been met, the chapter-in-training CO must place the following in an envelope:

- A new, completed and signed Vessel Registration Request (VRR) form.
- A copy of the CO's and XO's Officer Command College (OCC) Certificates.
- A copy of the DTS vessel approval letter.
- A check or money order for the current chartering fee made out to STARFLEET (if applicable). Contact Chief of Shakedown Operations, STARFLEET to verify..
- Three Self-Addressed Stamped Envelopes one addressed to the RC, one to the Chief of Shakedown Operations, and one to the Chief of Operations.

This package is then sent to the CO of the Support Chapter, who will add his/her signature to the VRR and forward the entire package to the Regional Coordinator(s). Your region may also ask you to send a copy of this VRR to the Regional ShOC officers. Once the Regional Coordinator(s) signs the VRR, he/she will forward the package to the Chief of Shakedown Operations, STARFLEET. Once Shakedown Operations has received and verified the package, they will

forward it to the Chief of Operations, STARFLEET, who will then formally commission the chapter and promote the CO to the grade of O-6 and the XO to the grade of O-5 (provided they do not already hold those grades or higher).

#### 2) Electronically:

For an electronic submission of the commissioning VRR, the following process is followed:

- The prospective Chapter gets approval, via e-mail, from DTS. (The previous approval may be used here.)
- The prospective Chapter gets the OTS/OCC eligibility information via the STARFLEET Database or has a copy of the certificates which can be e-mailed as an attachment.
- The VRR PDF file is downloaded, printed, and filled out by the prospective Commissioning CO. The filled-out VRR is scanned and then e-mailed to the official e-mail addresses of the Support Chapter CO, the RC (both RCs if the Support Chapter is in a different Region), any Regional ShOC officers that may request it, and the Chief of Shakedown Operations, STARFLEET.
- After each person has signed the VRR, he/she scans it and sends it via e-mail attachment to the next person on the VRR distribution list. The DTS approval e-mail and the OTS/OCC eligibility information or certificates are attached to this e-mail.

Once Shakedown Operations has received and verified the package, they will forward it to the Chief of Operations, STARFLEET, who will then formally commission the chapter and promote the CO to the grade of O-6 and the XO to the grade of O-5 (provided they do not already hold those grades or higher).

For more detailed information concerning the STARFLEET Shakedown program and how to become a chapter of STARFLEET, please contact either the Chief of Shakedown Operations, STARFLEET or the Chief of Operations, STARFLEET (please include an SASE for all streetmail contacts). It is advised that proposed chapters maintain copies of all submitted material, especially the completed VRR.
